Participants enjoyed visits to the Veterans Memorial Museum in Germantown and Jungle Jim's International Market, rounding out a weekend of camaraderie and community.

















































9-11 Run to Remember 54 Run, Ruck, or Walk REMEMBER AND HONOR

The Liberation of Kuwait

In 1990, Saddam Hussein invaded Kuwait. Within 24 hours, Iraq's military occupied its southern neighbor and controlled nearly 30% of the world's oil supply. Iraq's brutal dictator then set his eyes on Saudi Arabia.

On January 17, 1991, the United States led coalition forces in the liberation of Kuwait, a campaign known as Operation Desert Storm. Roughly 600,000 American troops were deployed in support both Operation Desert Shield and Operation Desert Storm; nearly 400 died.

The Memorial

Today, the United States lacks a national memorial dedicated to the courage and sacrifice of its Armed Forces who honorably fought in Operation Desert Shield and Desert Storm. The National Desert Storm War Memorial Association's goal is for completion of the Memorial to coincide with the 30th Anniversary of Operation Desert Storm, in 2021.

Memorial Timeline

In 2014, the United States House of Representatives unanimously authorized construction of a Desert Storm and Desert Shield Memorial by a vote of 370-0.

In 2014, President Obama signed the law authorizing a National Desert Storm and Desert Shield Memorial in Washington D.C. In 2017, President Trump signed a bill into law authorizing a memorial to be built near the National Mall in Washington, D.C at an Area-I location.

In 2018, a site for the National Desert Storm and Desert Shield Memorial was approved.

Location

The Memorial will fall within the shadow of both the Lincoln and Vietnam Veterans Memorials, abutting the National Mall. The Memorial's site is at the southwest corner of Constitution Avenue and 23rd Street Northwest, Washington, D.C.

Financial Position

The Memorial's estimated cost is \$40 million. Current law stipulates that before groundbreaking can commence 110% of the projected budget must be raised. All efforts are backed exclusively by private sources. The law authorizing construction of the memorial prohibits the use of any federal funds to establish this commemorative work.

As of 31 Dec 2019, the NDSWM has raised \$9.0 million of the \$40 million-dollar goal: \$5.85 million relates to the memorial site award and \$3.15 million has been donated by individuals, businesses, foreign governments, and Veteran Service Organizations.

GEN M.B. RIDGWAY CHAPTER

The Dennis L. Via Chapter of the 82nd Airborne Division Association remains active in honoring the Airborne legacy, supporting veterans, and engaging the community. Named for General Dennis L. Via, the first Signal Corps officer to achieve four-star rank, the chapter provides a home for former members of the 82d Signal Battalion and all airborne signal soldiers.

In May 2025, members traveled to Fort Bragg, North Carolina, for All-American Week, joining thousands of veterans, active-duty paratroopers, and families.

Chapter highlights included participation in the division review, attending the veterans' memorial ceremony, viewing the division run, and reconnecting with paratroopers from across the country.

Members also attended the 82nd Airborne Division Association's annual convention, exchanging ideas on veteran support, preserving the division's legacy, and membership growth. Lessons learned are already shaping the chapter's future plans.

In September 2025, the chapter elected its newest executive committee

Our leaders are actively engaged in preparations for upcoming events and strengthening ties among former signal troopers.

Looking ahead to 2026, planning is underway for All-American Week 2026 and the San Antonio convention. Our goals for All American Week 2026 (May, Fort Bragg) are to boost member turnout, support memorial activities, and expand participation in division events.

Likewise, for the 2026 Association Convention (San Antonio), we look to increase attendance by former signal troopers and make the convention a signature event that reflects both history and vitality.

The Dennis L. Via Chapter continues to honor the past while serving today's Airborne—and Signal—community. All the Way!

The 81st anniversary of D-Day in Normandy, France, was fantastic! As part of the celebration, many WWII veterans were given the opportunity to return to Normandy. One organization to offer this amazing experience was the Best Defense Foundation (BDF). For many years, the BDF, founded by former NFL football player Donnie Edwards, has followed the motto of taking care of the ones who took care of us. This year, the BDF, along with its partners Delta Air Lines and Michelin, took 23 veterans from WWII to Normandy for a 10-day expense-free program to honor them and allow them the opportunity to feel the love and appreciation of the French people.

For the fourth year in a row, Delta Air Lines, as a partner of BDF, provided the air service to Normandy. All the veterans were provided with a volunteer caregiver to travel with them from their home of residence to Atlanta, GA. In Atlanta, the veterans were treated to a wonderful kickoff dinner at the Delta Flight Museum. Following the kickoff dinner, the next day, the veterans, caregivers, medical staff, Next Generation Students, and additional volunteers all boarded a privately chartered Delta Boeing 767-300 and flew directly from Atlanta, Georgia to Deauville Airport in Normandy, France. All the veterans were provided with first-class seats while being closely attended to by the best flight crew members in the aviation industry, as well as a top-notch hand-selected medical staff specifically trained in the health care of the elderly. This medical staff, along with their caregivers, remained with the veterans throughout the entire 10-day program.

The average age of the veterans attending with the BDF this year was 99. The oldest veteran among the group was 2LT Betty Huffman-Rosevear, Army Nurse Corps, who turned 104 while in France. With the number of veterans, volunteer caregivers, and medical staff, the organization is divided up into squads of 4-5 veterans per squad. Each squad has a volunteer assigned as a 24/7 caregiver for their veteran, a medical staff member, and a Next Generation Student. Each squad has a volunteer squad leader who ensures the health and safety of the entire squad while coordinating with leadership on program activities. Last year, Delta Air Lines Captain Earl Tingle III was selected to be one of the ten volunteer caregivers out of over 300+ who applied for the





caregiver position from Delta Air Lines. Earl served as a caregiver for Veteran Paul Priest of Box Elder, SD. This year, Earl had the pleasure and honor of serving as a Squad Leader for 5 WWII veterans.

During the 10-day program, the veterans had the opportunity to speak at a local school in Normandy. Here, they had the chance to sit in the



classroom with the students and answer their questions in a close and intimate environment. Speaking with the French students, along with the BDF Next Generation students, ensures that the sacrifices of these veterans will never be forgotten. The veterans also had the opportunity to pay their respects to their friends and battle buddies who were killed in the war






during private visits to both the Normandy American Cemetery at Omaha Beach and the Brittany American Cemetery.

The veterans went on daily excursions throughout Normandy during this program. They visited Utah Beach, Mont St Michel, and attended the French Freedom Prize ceremony in Caen, France. One of the other major highlights of the program was the parade in Carentan, France. Here, the

veterans were cheered by the thousands who came to witness this parade of heroes. One moving event during this program was when a Frenchman by the name of Raymond Rivoal, who was orphaned during the Battle of Carentan in World War II when he was 8 years old, was reunited with





the soldier who saved him. Raymond came under the care of BDF veteran SSgt George K. Mullins, from the 327th Glider Infantry Regiment, 101st Airborne. SSgt Mullins was just 19 at the time provided Raymond with food and supplies and ensured his safe transfer to an orphanage before his unit moved on. Raymond has spent decades searching for the soldier who saved his life.



At the Omaha Beach ceremony, dignitaries from numerous countries gave welcome speeches to the Veterans and visitors. Our US Secretary of Defense, Pete Hegseth's speech focused on the valor and determination of the soldiers who came ashore the morning of 6 June following the earlier air drops of the 82nd and 101st Airborne Divisions. He also noted that today's military has exceptional role models in the US military of 1944. Several C-130s made passes along the beach during his speech, and platoons of Paratroopers of the 82nd were part of the honor guard. On 8 June, there was a sky full of parachutes at La Fiere DZ – this is the same DZ that the 82nd jumped into on 6 June 1944. This year, the estimate was that more than 600 paratroopers made the jump that day. The C-130s and other aircraft made numerous trips to the airport to take on more jumpers that morning. Paratroopers from the 82nd, as well as paratroopers from other countries, added a jump into La Fiere DZ in their jump log.

Already, plans are being made for the D-Day celebration for 2026. This will be another celebration worthy of a Paratrooper's attendance. Airborne! Col (Ret) Earl Tingle served as the Division Reenlistment officer and S3 of the 82nd Signal Battalion 1981-1983. This was his 15th trip to the D-Day celebrations.





PARAGLIDE GUIDE

The Paraglide is your magazine. To make it professional and easy to read as possible, the following guidelines and pointers are offered.

CHAPTER NEWS

Space - Under the current structure of the Paraglide, each chapter is allocated a half page and we will use all submissions. When chapters submit more than that amount, it becomes necessary for the Executive Director to edit. You can calculate the one half page space using the following method. Set margins so that you have a 60-character line. Approximately 50 lines will equal one half page. Subtract approximately 12 to 15 lines for each photo.

Issue Dates - The Paraglide is published on the 30th of January, April, July and October. When you submit, write as if all events up to the publication date have taken place even if they haven't or hold it until the next issue.

STYLE

Ranks: It is policy of the Association to only use rank when the individual is active duty SGT, a general officer MG, or when the individual retired CSM (R) or former rank is significant to the story. Dates and Times: All dates and times are written civilian style. Do not include day with date; example: 4 p.m., July 15, 2009.

Please send the items below to the Executive Director, not the Paraglide Editor. This is necessary in order to maintain accurate Association Records.

NEWS ARTICLES

News stories are generally based on an event and are reported written in the inverted pyramid style. This means the most important facts should go into the first paragraph, with the other details following in descending order of importance.

FEATURES

Feature stories are the soul of any publication. They're the heartwarming personality profiles, the tragic but heroic war stories, the photo features that make you believe you're there and the indomitable histories of people and events that have shaped the 82nd and the Association.

PHOTOS

The 82nd Airborne Division Association is a dynamic group and the Paraglide should reflect that energy. When possible, submit action photos as opposed to posed or static shots. A good rule of thumb is to select photos in which the subjects' heads are dime-size or larger. Neither Xerox copies nor newspaper clippings can be reproduced for publication. Caption: Identify everyone in the photo whose face is clearly shown. From left to right, include their first and last names.

FORMAT FOR SUBMISSIONS

Submissions should be typed in upper and lower case letters. Please do not type in all capital letters. The name of your chapter should appear at the top of the page. When mailing, you may send registered or return receipt requested.

DEADLINES

The Paraglide deadlines are firm and should reflect upcoming events and those which took place the previous quarter.
