

COLONEL MORTON N. KATZ: A LIFE OF SERVICE, HONOR, AND COMMITMENT

The 82nd Airborne Division Association remembers with deep respect and gratitude the life of Colonel (Ret.) Morton N. Katz, who passed away on February 3, 2025, at the remarkable age of 105 years and 8 months. A paratrooper, patriot, attorney, and lifelong public servant, Mort Katz embodied the Airborne spirit—undaunted, honorable, and forever committed to duty.

Born and raised in Hartford, Connecticut, Mort graduated from Weaver High School in 1935, earned his undergraduate degree from the University of Connecticut, and a master's from Iowa State. He then answered his country's call during World War II, commissioned as a 1st Lieutenant and assigned as an S-2 Intelligence Officer. He served with distinction in the 509th Parachute Infantry Battalion and the 82nd Airborne Division.

Col. Katz parachuted into history, participating in nine major campaigns across North Africa and Europe, including Algeria-French Morocco, Tunisia, Naples-Foggia, Anzio, Rome-Arno, Southern France, Rhineland, the Ardennes, and Central Europe. His decorations reflect both bravery and service: the Combat Infantryman Badge, Bronze Star with Oak Leaf Cluster, Legion of Merit, the EAME Campaign Medal with 9 Battle Stars and Arrowhead, Distinguished Unit Citation with Oak Leaf Cluster, and the Belgian Fourragere. His military career spanned over three decades, retiring from the U.S. Army Reserve in 1979 with the rank of Colonel.

Even into his second century, Mort continued to serve. He participated in Memorial Day observances each year, always in uniform, standing at attention to honor the flag and fallen comrades. He was a proud and active member of VFW Post 3272 in Avon for more than 20 years.

After returning home from the war, Mort earned his Juris Doctorate from UConn Law School and began a legal career that would span nearly eight decades. Known for his tireless advocacy, he practiced law until the age of 103, served as a Justice of the Peace, and remained a Special Public Defender until he was 100. Mort was known not only for his legal skill but for the care, fairness, and compassion he brought to every case.

His service extended far beyond the courtroom. Mort was Past Master of St. John's Lodge AF & AM and Past District Deputy for Masonic District 6A. He also served as Past Worthy Grand Patron of the Order of Eastern Star of Connecticut. In his community, he was active with the Avon/Canton Chamber of Commerce, receiving both the Loren Bristol Spirit Award and the Small Business of the Year Award for his efforts to strengthen local business and civic life.

For the 82nd Airborne Division Association, Col. Katz was more than a decorated veteran—he was a pillar of our community, our Judge Advocate Emeritus, and a guiding voice of reason, tradition, and honor. His wisdom and dedication enriched the Association and inspired generations of troopers.

He is survived by his loving wife and family, who shared in and supported his long life of service and dedication.

Colonel Morton Katz's legacy will live on in the hearts of his fellow paratroopers, and in the example he set for all who wear the uniform.

STILL SERVING: COMING TOGETHER TO ASSIST MILITARY FAMILY AFTER HURRICANE HELENE

Recovery efforts continue across the mountains of Western North Carolina in the wake of Hurricane Helene, and the 82nd Airborne Division Association remains actively involved in supporting those still struggling to rebuild. Thanks to a joint effort led by the St. Michael's All Airborne Chapter, based in Western North Carolina, one military family who lost everything is now a step closer to stability.

The family, from near Burnsville in Yancey County, lost their home to flooding and had no place to go. Their son, a young Marine, is preparing to deploy to Korea and was deeply concerned about his family's situation. That concern set off a chain of action across state lines.

James Slemp, a member of our West Virginia Chapter, generously donated a travel trailer to help. He reached out to the Association, and the request made its way to St. Michael's All Airborne Chapter Founder and Chairman, Gil Gilleland, who helps coordinate support efforts across Western NC and beyond. The chapter worked quickly to locate a family in need, aided by local fire departments and Denver United Methodist Church.

Enter David Gryder—a Marine and Vietnam veteran from Sherrills Ford, NC, and a retired truck driver with four decades behind the wheel—who volunteered to drive to West Virginia, pick up the trailer, and haul it back to the mountains of North Carolina. The trailer is now staged near the family's former home, which was completely washed away. Since the area is only accessible via footbridge, plans are in motion to sling-load the trailer into final position via an Army Chinook helicopter.

Efforts are ongoing to stock the trailer with food, supplies, and essentials, in coordination with several local veteran organizations.

This is just one example of the kind of direct, personal support being provided to military families by members of the 82nd Airborne Division Association. There are many more still in need across our mountain communities, and we are proud to answer the call.







ALWAYS AIRBORNE

This is the story of a Paratrooper. It's a representative story where Me, We, He or Us will often be described as "I", but represents the many thousands of everyday Paratroopers. While I will sometimes use examples from my own life, it just as well could be anyone of the many Troopers that were raised by the 82Nd at Ft. Bragg.

This is the "Non-Lifer" story even though we all made Lifer books. This is about the Paratrooper that, for the most part, only did one enlistment and never planned to do more. The is one from Alabama that did visit Mississippi, and maybe Georgia a few times, before he enlisted. The eager youngster that went to the Army recruiter, took the test and was told that he tested high in many other areas, and made the recruiter smile when he said "I just want to be a soldier." Then he saw the poster on the wall and declared he wanted to be a Paratrooper. After all, he had seen many movies and TV series about WWII Paratroopers. Never been in a plane in his life but my first time, jumped out of it.

He left home and, like all others, soon grew up and grew up fast. Life's difficulties didn't get easier throughout every step of our training. After Basic training came Infantry school then Airborne school. All those songs that were sung on those morning runs were starting to make sense. He was a U.S. Paratrooper. More was expected of Paratroopers. In Infantry he was the "Queen of Battle" now he was the pride of his Nation's Army. That was about to come to light when the next step was reporting to his duty station assigned to the 82Nd Airborne Division at Ft. Bragg, NC.

Home sweet home, Ft. Bragg, NC. That first four-year enlistment at the grand old age of 17 to 21 years. Everything was burned and engrained into us. We were hyper-aware and soaked in everything. So much so that even 40 plus years later it's still in us. We were America's Guard of Honor. Ft. Bragg was a serious place. The 82nd was serious about its mission statement: "To Deploy Anywhere, Anytime by Land, Sea or Air, and Accomplish any Mission given" That about covers it. Everything about being in the 82nd Airborne Division was about being the very best. Nothing was easy. Nothing was given, it was earned.

Now! Back to what this story is really all about.

Remember the Paratrooper that represents the vast majority of those that served in the 82nd? You know the "Non-Lifer"? When you were at Ft. Bragg, or the surrounding areas, it seemed that everyone was Airborne. Sure, there were still plenty of "legs" around that you could clearly try and make them understand that "They can't be like me, Airborne Infantry", but for the most part, it was an Airborne world. Then came your return to everyday life back at home or anywhere away from Ft. Bragg and the 82nd. You then realize just how few Paratroopers there really are in the world. You knew you were part of an elite unit, now maybe more so than ever you realize it. The rest of your life would be a testament to what was instilled into you as a Paratrooper in the 82nd Airborne Division. You will always strive to be the best. Have more intestinal fortitude. Pride in what you do. Look the best. All of the above. It's in you. Always a Paratrooper.

Our next career or chapter in life will always be guided by our upbringing from the 82nd. I went on to serve as a State Trooper and was very proud to do so. I owe how that next 25 years went to me being a Paratrooper. Top of my class in an Academy that everyone thought was difficult. Not for an 82nd Paratrooper. Picked to be a S.W.A.T. member, Team Leader and S.W.A.T. Instructor -- piece of cake. After living the life in the Airborne Infantry 2/505th, you have the attitude that you can accomplish anything. Enter a door on someone that just killed several, no problem. Remember the term we used: Airborne Crazy! Life wasn't always a Hollywood jump from the rear ramp of a Chinook helicopter. Sometimes it was a full combat equipment

night jump (semi controlled fall out of the door) from a C-130. But, all in all, the military bearing (brain washing) and mission statement from the 82nd would always get me through. Remember! There were a whole bunch of "legs" out there and very few Paratroopers so how could I be anything but the best? That is our mindset. Occasionally when I did come across another Paratrooper and, in particular, an 82nd Trooper, the difference was CLEAR. We were better students, employees and stood out in anything we did.

We then became the "Old Paratroopers." Although we only spent a few years at Ft. Bragg compared to the ones that made a career in the Army, the 82nd will forever be in us. We wear our caps and shirts. We have our jump wings on our trucks and jacket lapel. We say "Airborne" to close a prayer or blessing. To this day I wear my dog tags, polished jump boots and try to lead from the front showing my employees what it means to be Airborne. I'm asked a lot what exactly does it mean to be Airborne? It's not just a saying. It's a way of life. You can teach a monkey to jump out of an airplane, but it takes much more to become a Paratrooper. So, while most of us only served for a much shorter time, the influence of the 82nd serves the society of our great nation in the life stories of so many of us "Plain Ole Paratroopers".

After 40 years I'm returning to Ft. Bragg. I will be attending the events of All American Week with the 82nd Airborne Division Association. I clearly remember being a part of live fire and jump demonstrations for old timers while I was there. I know I will meet many "Lifers" and with upmost respect and gratitude for their service wonder what might have been. Most of all, I will be home with a brotherhood that runs deep. I'm so very proud to be in that group.


FINAL JUMP: HONORING SGT JOE HARRIS OF THE 555TH "TRIPLE NICKLES"

The 82nd Airborne Division Association pays tribute to SGT Joe Harris of Compton, California, who passed away at the age of 108. A proud member of the legendary 555th Parachute Infantry Battalion—the "Triple Nickles"—Sgt. Harris was among the last surviving members of this historic unit.

Formed during World War II, the Triple Nickles were the U.S. Army's first all-Black parachute unit, breaking barriers and setting the standard for excellence and courage under challenging circumstances. In 1945, Sgt. Harris and his fellow Triple Nickles conducted more than 1,200 parachute jumps during **Operation Firefly**, a mission aimed at countering Japanese aggression against the United States. These jumps—often into rugged, remote terrain—were hazardous and demanding. The unit became known not just for their bravery but for their professionalism, discipline, and trailblazing role in shaping the future of the U.S. Army.

SGT Harris's legacy, and that of the Triple Nickles, lives on in every paratrooper who follows. He and his brothers-in-arms helped clear the way—both in the sky and in our military history—for future generations of Airborne soldiers. We salute his service, his strength, and the example he set for all of us.

Rest in peace, SGT Joe Harris. Airborne, All the Way.

The Liberation of Kuwait

In 1990, Saddam Hussein invaded Kuwait. Within 24 hours, Iraq's military occupied its southern neighbor and controlled nearly 30% of the world's oil supply. Iraq's brutal dictator then set his eyes on Saudi Arabia.

On January 17, 1991, the United States led coalition forces in the liberation of Kuwait, a campaign known as Operation Desert Storm. Roughly 600,000 American troops were deployed in support both Operation Desert Shield and Operation Desert Storm; nearly 400 died.

The Memorial

Today, the United States lacks a national memorial dedicated to the courage and sacrifice of its Armed Forces who honorably fought in Operation Desert Shield and Desert Storm. The National Desert Storm War Memorial Association's goal is for completion of the Memorial to coincide with the 30th Anniversary of Operation Desert Storm, in 2021.

Memorial Timeline

In 2014, the United States House of Representatives unanimously authorized construction of a Desert Storm and Desert Shield Memorial by a vote of 370-0.

In 2014, President Obama signed the law authorizing a National Desert Storm and Desert Shield Memorial in Washington D.C. In 2017, President Trump signed a bill into law authorizing a memorial to be built near the National Mall in Washington, D.C at an Area-l location.

In 2018, a site for the National Desert Storm and Desert Shield Memorial was approved.

Location

The Memorial will fall within the shadow of both the Lincoln and Vietnam Veterans Memorials, abutting the National Mall. The Memorial's site is at the southwest corner of Constitution Avenue and 23rd Street Northwest, Washington, D.C.

Financial Position

The Memorial's estimated cost is \$40 million. Current law stipulates that before groundbreaking can commence 110% of the projected budget must be raised. All efforts are backed exclusively by private sources. The law authorizing construction of the memorial prohibits the use of any federal funds to establish this commemorative work.

As of 31 Dec 2019, the NDSWM has raised \$9.0 million of the \$40 million-dollar goal: \$5.85 million relates to the memorial site award and \$3.15 million has been donated by individuals, businesses, foreign governments, and Veteran Service Organizations.





A Second Chance: Remembering April 8th, 2012

Some might say that April 8th, 2012, was the worst day of Staff Sergeant Alejandro (Alex) Jauregui's life. But over time, that day has come to symbolize something else—not an ending, but the beginning of a second chance.

It was Easter Sunday, and back at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, Alex's wife, Isa Marie, was home with their two sons, Daniel (3) and Bron (7). Five months pregnant with their third child, she had just learned they were expecting a baby girl. The news had filled her with joy and anticipation, and she couldn't wait to share it with her husband, who was deployed in Afghanistan. Alex and Isa Marie had met years earlier while both were serving in Iraq. After eight years of active duty as a Multiple Launch Rocket Systems Repairer in the Army, Isa Marie was preparing to transition out of service. On that quiet Easter morning, she was soaking up precious time with her children—especially with her youngest curled up on her lap watching cartoons. Though her growing belly made it increasingly difficult, she wasn't willing to give up those snuggles. She remembered the pain of leaving him behind at just 8 months old for a deployment, and the heartbreak of returning home to a child who didn't recognize her. Those cuddles, hard-won, meant everything.

Several time zones away, Alex was on a mission with Bravo Company, 2/508th Parachute Infantry Regiment in Zhari, Afghanistan. The assignment that day was to escort an Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) team to investigate an IED site identified by second squad. Upon arriving, Alex located a second IED. As he briefed the EOD team, word came from his team leader about a possible third device nearby. While walking to verify that it was in fact a third IED, Alex stepped on a fourth IED. Though he'd experienced IED explosions before, this time felt different. He felt no pain, but he knew—it had been him. SGT Hammer rushed to his side and began administering first aid. A medevac request was made, but it was denied. Fortunately, a Special Forces team en route to another mission overheard the radio traffic and made the critical decision to divert and extract Alex—a decision that, without a doubt, saved his life.

Back home, Isa Marie's peaceful morning was interrupted by a phone call from an unknown number. She hesitated but answered, her toddler still nestled in her lap. On the other end was her husband's rear detachment commander. His voice trembled.

"I don't know how to tell you this," he said, "so I'm just going to read the white line message."

He shared what little information was known: Alex had sustained a traumatic brain injury and had lost both of his legs. He was in surgery. There was uncertainty in every detail, but one thing was clear—their lives had changed forever. Isa Marie didn't cry. She didn't panic. She felt numb. Questions flooded her mind—how would she tell their sons? Could a 3-and 7-year-old even understand what war had done to their father? What if she reassured them he would be okay, only for him not to survive one of the many surgeries ahead? But somehow, the Jauregui family pressed on.

The soldiers Alex called brothers stayed by his side on the battlefield. A helicopter crew chief, moved by a sense of duty and compassion, made a split-second decision that altered the course of Alex's life. And Alex, with his fierce determination and trademark stubbornness, fought to survive.

That same spirit carried him through grueling days of recovery and continues to sustain him today.

Thirteen years later, the family reflects on April 8th not solely as a day of tragedy, but as the moment they were given a second chance. What began as the worst day of their lives turned out to be the day they got a second chance. Now the couple live in Northern California where Alex and his brother Cristian run a commercial beekeeping operation with close to 1200 beehives.


Remembering Charles Milton "Andy" Andersen, Jr.



The Paraglide is your magazine. To make it professional and easy to read as possible, the following guidelines and pointers are offered.

CHAPTER NEWS

Space - Under the current structure of the Paraglide, each chapter is allocated a half page and we will use all submissions. When chapters submit more than that amount, it becomes necessary for the Executive Director to edit. You can calculate the one half page space using the following method. Set margins so that you have a 60-character line. Approximately 50 lines will equal one half page. Subtract approximately 12 to 15 lines for each photo.

Issue Dates - The Paraglide is published on the 30th of January, April, July and October. When you submit, write as if all events up to the publication date have taken place even if they haven't or hold it until the next issue.

STYLE

Ranks: It is policy of the Association to only use rank when the individual is active duty SGT, a general officer MG, or when the individual retired CSM (R) or former rank is significant to the story. Dates and Times: All dates and times are written civilian style. Do not include day with date; example: 4 p.m., July 15, 2009.

Please send the items below to the Executive Director, not the Paraglide Editor. This is necessary in order to maintain accurate Association Records.

NEWS ARTICLES

News stories are generally based on an event and are reported written in the inverted pyramid style. This means the most important facts should go into the first paragraph, with the other details following in descending order of importance.

FEATURES

Feature stories are the soul of any publication. They're the heartwarming personality profiles, the tragic but heroic war stories, the photo features that make you believe you're there and the indomitable histories of people and events that have shaped the 82nd and the Association.

PHOTOS

The 82nd Airborne Division Association is a dynamic group and the Paraglide should reflect that energy. When possible, submit action photos as opposed to posed or static shots. A good rule of thumb is to select photos in which the subjects' heads are dime-size or larger. Neither Xerox copies nor newspaper clippings can be reproduced for publication. Caption: Identify everyone in the photo whose face is clearly shown. From left to right, include their first and last names.

FORMAT FOR SUBMISSIONS

Submissions should be typed in upper and lower case letters. Please do not type in all capital letters. The name of your chapter should appear at the top of the page. When mailing, you may send registered or return receipt requested.

DEADLINES
