June 6, 1944...

"This is the day that changed the world...When history held its breath."

The story is a familiar one in times of war and acts of bravery, but this story features an 82nd Airborne trooper who accidentally made history on D Day, 1944. John Marvin Steele is celebrated both in his hometown of Metropolis, IL and in Sainte-Mere-Eglise, France.

Steele was one of many heroes who took the leap that day to liberate Europe. From a plane that was under fire by German flak, Steele's company jumped into Sainte-Mere-Eglise through a hail of bullets. Many perished in the sky before ever



reaching France soil. Steele along with trooper Kenneth Russell became entangled on a church's spires in the square of Sainte-Mere-Eglise. Another trooper, John Ray, made it to the ground below the two soldiers. Ray was shot by a German soldier but before expiring was able to return fire, killing the enemy and saving the lives of Kenneth Russell and John Steele. Russell was able to cut himself free to join the battle below, but Steele, with an injured foot from shrapnel, dropped his knife and so remained dangling helplessly from the spire. With two German soldiers nearby in the tower of the church, Steele played dead to survive while the battle raged below. Those solders would take Steele prisoner after the battle. Later, Steele was able to escape through a window of the German Command post to rejoin his unit and continue to fight. Steele was awarded the Bronze Star and Purple Heart for his actions.

In present day Sainte-Mere-Eglise, D Day activities center around this story and the heroism of the 82nd AB with an effigy of Steele remaining on the church spire, an accidental hero. The church stained glass windows feature the troopers jumping from their planes. This event is also depicted in the book and movie, "The Longest Day", and John Steele's character is played by Red Buttons. Steele is featured on a commemorative Monopoly game, World War II video games and even Poland's version of Legos. A group of citizens from John's hometown of Metropolis, Illinois have formed a not for profit 501(c)3 corporation, Heroes of Massac Endeavors, or simply, HOME. Their mission is to spotlight famous citizens from Massac County. soldiers of World War II andto tell the story of that fateful day.





HOME has already erected a sign coming into Metropolis denoting this as the hometown of WW 2 Hero John Marvin Steele, the paratrooper in The Longest Day. One of the members attended Sainte-Mere-Eglise's 80th celebration of D Day in Normandy. While there, Vicki Mayhall witnessed the signing of a Sister City Agreement between Sainte-Mere-Eglise and Metropolis, Illinois with Mayors Alain Holley in France and Don Canada in Metropolis, Illinois.

Heroes of Massac Endeavors' ultimate goal is a life size bronze statue of Steele on the courthouse lawn in Metropolis. A granite storyboard behind the statue will feature the story of Steele and his landing on the church, the importance of the battle and the resulting liberation of Europe. It will additionally recognize all World War II KIA/MIA veterans from Massac County including John's younger brother Norman Steele who was KIA in Germany in the last days of the war. Also recognized will be William Luster Luekering who for 80 years has been listed as MIA. Luekering's remains

were found in Germany where his plane went down and in July, 2024 were brought home to Massac County to a fallen hero's welcome and funeral service.

Around the base of the statue, will be bricks featuring engraved names. This is a fundraiser for the statue and all funds will go towards the statue and upkeep. The bricks will feature three lines of 13 characters and can be purchased at HOME's website,

<u>www.heroesofmassacendeavors.org</u> A popular fundraiser has been the 1940's Swing Dance. This is the second year for this event and participants may dress in period costumes, dance or just enjoy the swinging music of the stage band. This event is planned for October 5 and tickets may be purchased on the website.

HOME also has t-shirts for sale on the website that feature John Marvin Steele. Donations may also be given through the website or by mailing a check to Heroes of Massac Endeavors, c/o City National Bank, Attn: Debbie Hillebrand, PO Box 380, Metropolis, IL 62960. 

The Liberation of Kuwait

In 1990, Saddam Hussein invaded Kuwait. Within 24 hours, Iraq's military occupied its southern neighbor and controlled nearly 30% of the world's oil supply. Iraq's brutal dictator then set his eyes on Saudi Arabia.

On January 17, 1991, the United States led coalition forces in the liberation of Kuwait, a campaign known as Operation Desert Storm. Roughly 600,000 American troops were deployed in support both Operation Desert Shield and Operation Desert Storm; nearly 400 died.

The Memorial

Today, the United States lacks a national memorial dedicated to the courage and sacrifice of its Armed Forces who honorably fought in Operation Desert Shield and Desert Storm. The National Desert Storm War Memorial Association's goal is for completion of the Memorial to coincide with the 30th Anniversary of Operation Desert Storm, in 2021.

Memorial Timeline

In 2014, the United States House of Representatives unanimously authorized construction of a Desert Storm and Desert Shield Memorial by a vote of 370-0.

In 2014, President Obama signed the law authorizing a National Desert Storm and Desert Shield Memorial in Washington D.C. In 2017, President Trump signed a bill into law authorizing a memorial to be built near the National Mall in Washington, D.C at an Area-location.

In 2018, a site for the National Desert Storm and Desert Shield Memorial was approved.

Location

The Memorial will fall within the shadow of both the Lincoln and Vietnam Veterans Memorials, abutting the National Mall. The Memorial's site is at the southwest corner of Constitution Avenue and 23rd Street Northwest, Washington, D.C.

Financial Position

The Memorial's estimated cost is \$40 million. Current law stipulates that before groundbreaking can commence 110% of the projected budget must be raised. All efforts are backed exclusively by private sources. The law authorizing construction of the memorial prohibits the use of any federal funds to establish this commemorative work.

As of 31 Dec 2019, the NDSWM has raised \$9.0 million of the \$40 million-dollar goal: \$5.85 million relates to the memorial site award and \$3.15 million has been donated by individuals, businesses, foreign governments, and Veteran Service Organizations.

PARAGLIDE GUIDE

The Paraglide is your magazine. To make it professional and easy to read as possible, the following guidelines and pointers are offered.

CHAPTER NEWS

Space - Under the current structure of the Paraglide, each chapter is allocated a half page and we will use all submissions. When chapters submit more than that amount, it becomes necessary for the Executive Director to edit. You can calculate the one half page space using the following method. Set margins so that you have a 60-character line. Approximately 50 lines will equal one half page. Subtract approximately 12 to 15 lines for each photo.

Issue Dates - The Paraglide is published on the 30th of January, April, July and October. When you submit, write as if all events up to the publication date have taken place even if they haven't or hold it until the next issue.

STYLE

Ranks: It is policy of the Association to only use rank when the individual is active duty SGT, a general officer MG, or when the individual retired CSM (R) or former rank is significant to the story. Dates and Times: All dates and times are written civilian style. Do not include day with date; example: 4 p.m., July 15, 2009.

NEWS ARTICLES

News stories are generally based on an event and are reported written in the inverted pyramid style. This means the most important facts should go into the first paragraph, with the other details following in descending order of importance.

FEATURES

Feature stories are the soul of any publication. They're the heartwarming personality profiles, the tragic but heroic war stories, the photo features that make you believe you're there and the indomitable histories of people and events that have shaped the 82nd and the Association.

PHOTOS

The 82nd Airborne Division Association is a dynamic group and the Paraglide should reflect that energy. When possible, submit action photos as opposed to posed or static shots. A good rule of thumb is to select photos in which the subjects' heads are dime-size or larger. Neither Xerox copies nor newspaper clippings can be reproduced for publication. Caption: Identify everyone in the photo whose face is clearly shown. From left to right, include their first and last names.

FORMAT FOR SUBMISSIONS

Submissions should be typed in upper and lower case letters. Please do not type in all capital letters. The name of your chapter should appear at the top of the page. When mailing, you may send registered or return receipt requested.

DEADLINES
